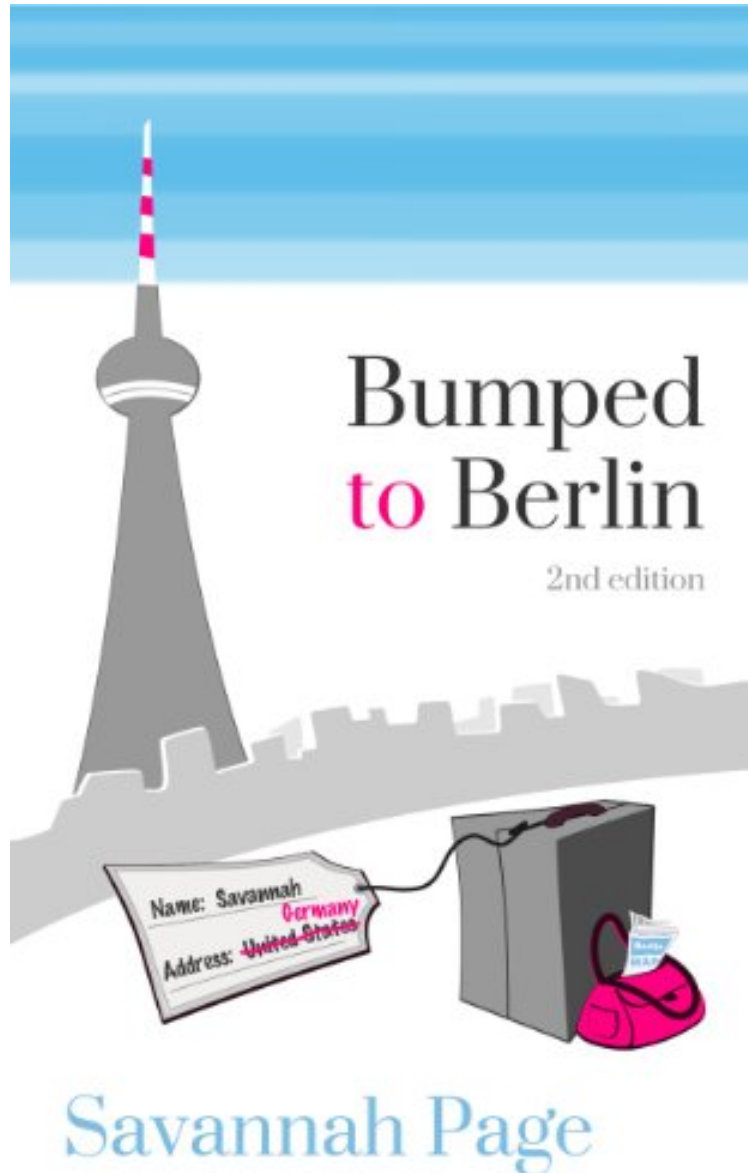

I especially had a good laugh, when reading her description of a typical American Thanksgiving turkey, which wouldn't fit in a German oven. Her difficulties with German grocery shopping made me remember my own experience as a German living for a year in Japan, when every day occurrences such as shopping became obstacle courses to be mastered. If you expect a guide to living in Germany you picked the wrong book.
