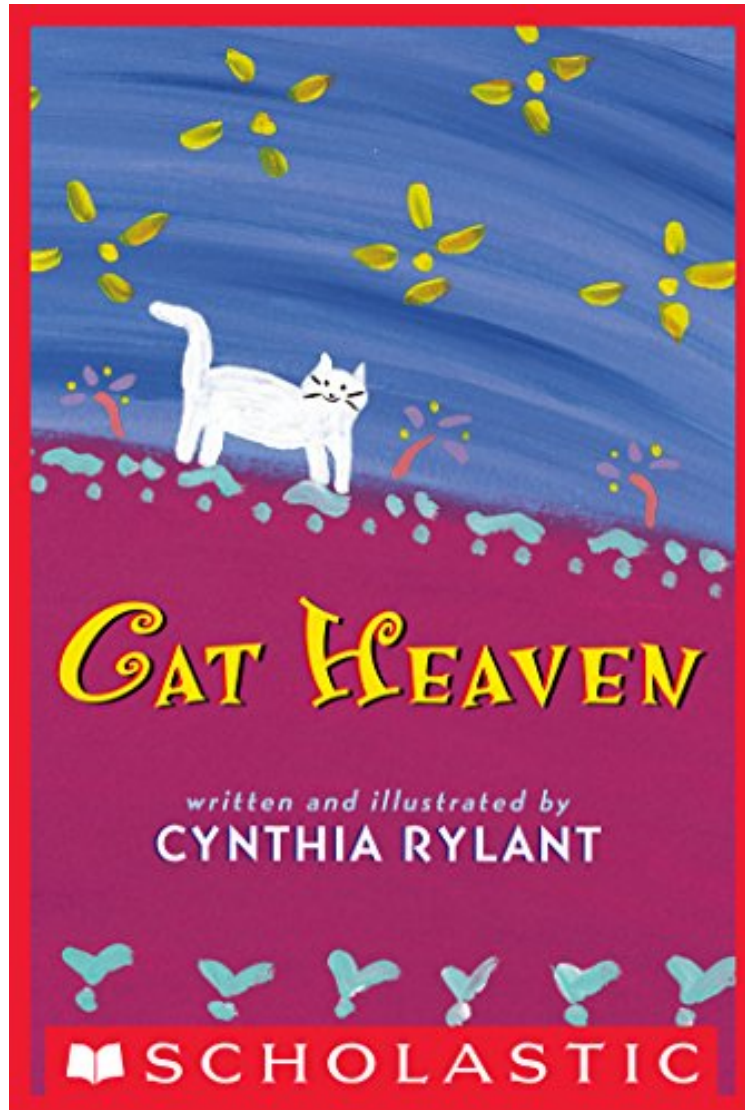

It has depressed the hell out of me and upset the whole family. Perhaps a picture of a cat remembering the family he left behind and dreaming of a future reunion would have been better than a

cat watching his old home from afar. That sense of abandonment and isolation left me feeling hopeless. Von V. Smith This book should help any very young child who has lost or is about to lose a pet. Actually it might be a good idea to read while the pet is still healthy--parents, too! Although there is a lot of imagination (as to how God runs this heaven, cats sleeping on God's head, on laps, etc.) in this it is done so well it makes us all feel good. I would like to take exception to that one professional reviewer's opinion re 'faulty theology' that pets might visit here from the other side since it appears that she believes they don't have an afterlife. If she thinks this unsound theology, she might consult her Bible, which says something quite different; they do. And some do, indeed, 'visit' with their people (a book I recommend below goes into this in detail). Dog Heaven presents this in such a way that will not frighten children at all. It will make them hopeful. Perhaps Cynthia Rylant had this experience, or knows someone who had. Although I take the position that people and their pets alike (as well as animals in general) will share the same Heaven, I can see no harm in a dog or cat heaven premise for young children. Parents can always say the child can visit, or that the animals can come and live in 'people heaven' if they wish to. Also highly recommended: FOR EVERY DOG AN ANGEL--an absolutely marvelous book for children and adults; puppy's angel stays with it throughout its life; "forever dog" may visit after passing over 'angel bridge'; eventually we cross the "angel bridge" to be reunited with our precious "forever dogs" (or any beloved pet with which we have bonded). THE SOUL OF YOUR PET: solid, convincing evidence for animal afterlife; Will cause even the hardened skeptic to rethink his views.
