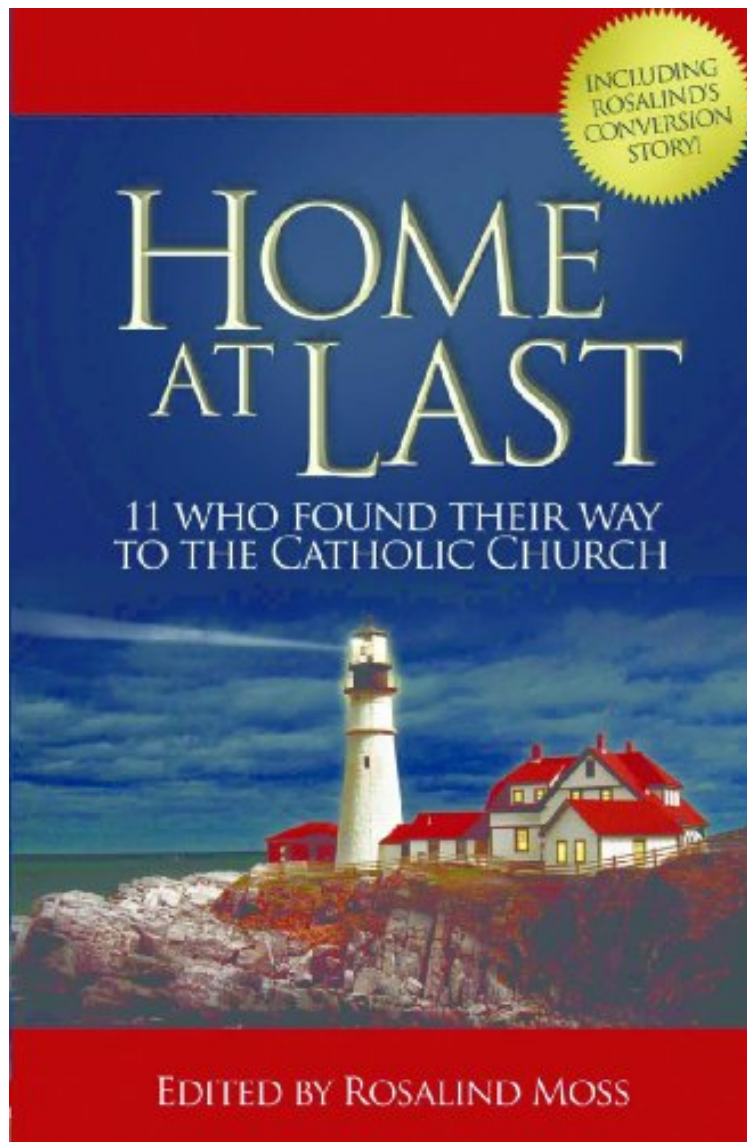

Some stories are very complicated, authors struggling with questions which could seem very obscure to basic believers. The drawback of this book is that we read only about conversions from pretty very religious people to catholicism - there is no conversion from atheist or some pagan consumer so the question is only about crossing the border to catholicism after some serious weighting of facts and peculiar experiencies of authors already seekers of ultimate truth about life, death and afterlife. I prefer stories from Rosalind Moss and a story from the author that had experiences with smell of roses. There is an excellent essay of C.S. Lewis from the book Present Concerns where he wrote why is so difficult to convert nowadays modern men and you can complement both readings for better understanding of this book. For me was also very interesting how interested were authors - probably all of them Americans - about questions that bothered them. I can hardly imagine Europeans that seek so desperately and profoundly about religious issues - in that respect is Europe lost in its secularism and has no future in this respect only waiting its demise in flood of multiculturalism and without respect for its own legacy and roots.
