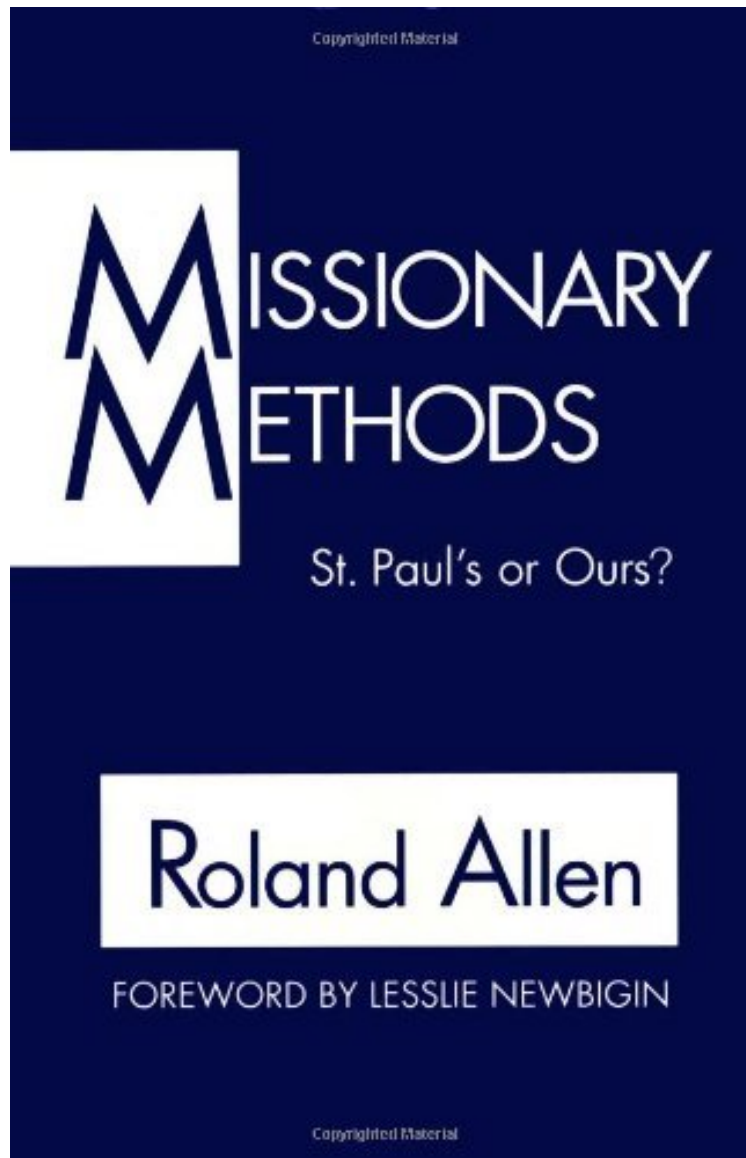

It was written in 1912, knowing that it would not come into vogue until the 1960's. There is a great deal of insight into the actual planning necessary for the mission. The need also to be able to designate and stand back, or as Allen says to 'retire' from the work at the time. Insight into the way the church has dealt with 'heathen' people treating them really as second class citizens, always there to help, but not to encourage and train up to be able to take over in the mission. It is well worth reading, with its main emphasis on the way the apostle Paul conducted missions. I believe that sometimes Allen gets confused with the Spirit of Paul, and the Holy Spirit. He places much on what Paul did and did not do and it could be seen that he makes more of Paul, great though he was (and is), but takes away from the all-emcompassing power of the Holy Spirit. All in terms of how Paul planted churches.He questions the validity of statements that suggest Pauls methods are no longer relevent for todays cultures by highlighting the many similartys between the many sub-cultures that existed in the Roman empire and those that we find today.
