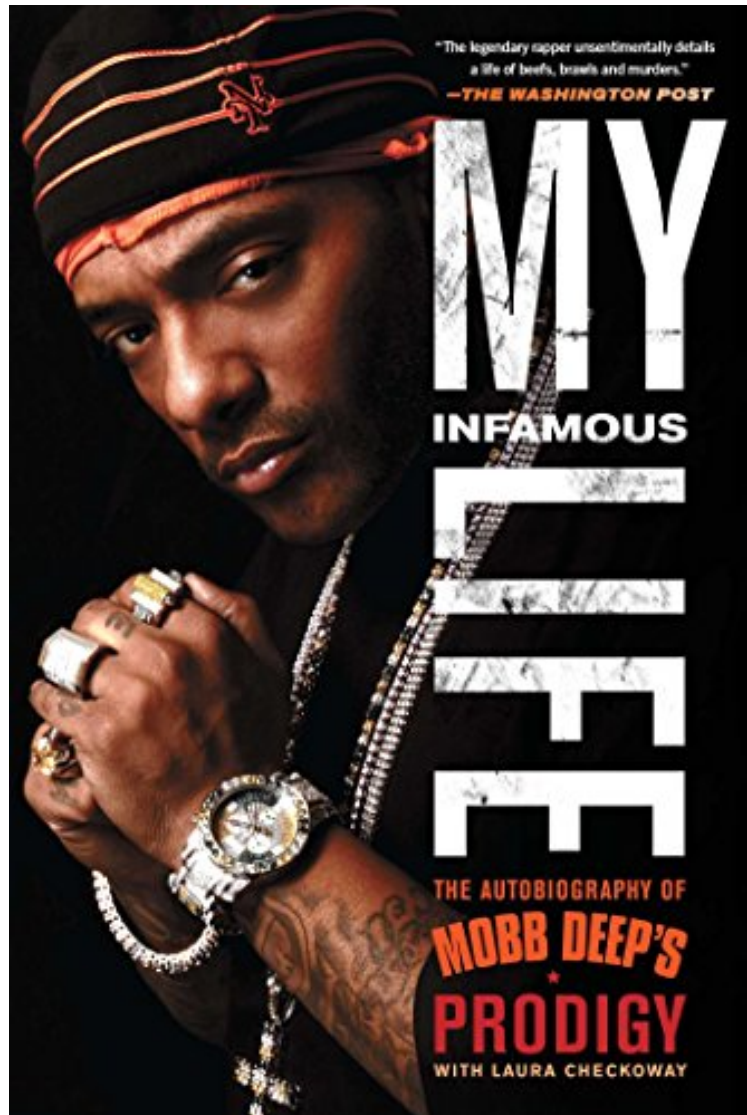

Memories of a Real Rapper Von Bud Foxzunchst mal: ich halte nichts von ellenlangen Rezensionen, daher fasse ich mich kurz. das buch bietet einen einblick ber die anfnge von prodigy und mobb deep bis heute. die kapitel sind nach den albumnamen benannt und beschreiben dann die jeweiligen erlebnisse in der zeit des jeweiligen albums. lustige geschichten gemischt mit ernsthaften themen, wie P's krankheit, tod und andere dinge. man bekommt auch einen guten einblick was das musicbiz angeht, zumindest das im rapgame. leute wie jay-z (welcher sein fett hier abbekommt), pac, biggie, snoop, nas, 50 etc bekommen auch einzelne passagen gewidmet. das buch scheint mir ehrlich geschrieben zu sein. also nicht immer auf die tour: ich bin sooowas von hart. natrlich wird auch eine portion bertreibung dabei sein (aber in welcher biographie ist das nicht so), jedoch ist es gut zu wissen, dass es noch rapper gibt, die keine studiogangsters sind. der eindruck ber sein leben und das seiner weggefhrten verfestigt sich in seinen texten und den beats, die nicht (ausschlielich) zum geldscheffeln gemacht wird, sondern das harte leben der unterschicht in den usa widerspiegeln. das buch ist in englisch geschrieben, es wre auch nicht mglich es authentisch zu bersetzen. die sprache gleicht derjenigen in seinen lyrics. ist man einigermaen mit dem slang vertraut (z.b. durch jahrzehntelanges rap-hren ;-)), so lsst es sich gut lesen. selbst wenn man einzelne wrter nicht kennt, so versteht man jedoch immer den zusammenhang. FAZIT: Fr alle, die noch wahren rap hren (und nicht "pop the champagne; girls shake your booties"-quatsch auf technobeats) und einen einblick ber das leben von einer rap-legende haben wollen, kann ich das buch uneingeschrnkt empfehlen!
