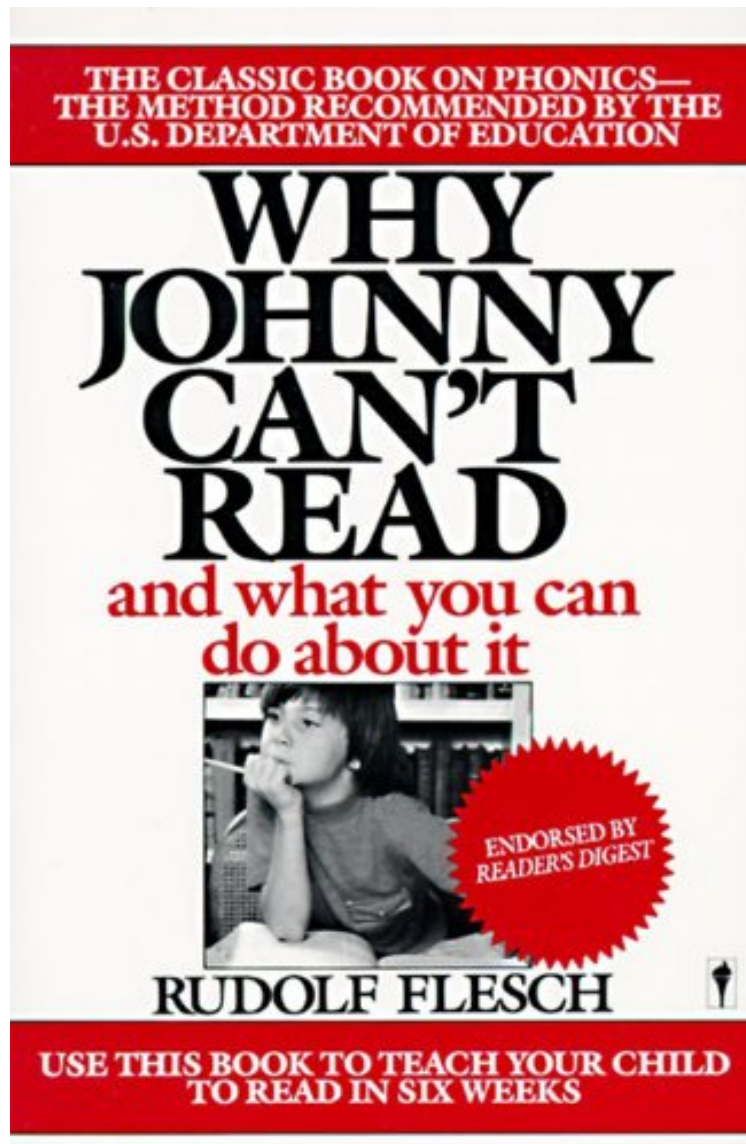

Because he's being taught in the wrong way, says Flesch, and he's right. I know. I was being taught that way in 1959, and I couldn't learn to read

either. What can you do about it? Well if it's your own child, teach them yourself, using phonics. Flesch lays out a comprehensive course, usable by anyone who can already read. My mother taught me with phonics (she had no training or experience in teaching, by the way), and I quickly jumped to number two in my reading class. But if the question is, what can you do about the failure of our schools, the answer is "Nothing." Here is the only place Flesch falls down. This book was published in 1955. After 44 years, the situation has only gotten worse. This is because the people running the public school system want it this way, and the country's parents won't fire them all. Sad but true. Point taken, not very well writtenVon Ein KundeFlesch's point is that the way to teach Englishreading writing is by phonics, and thatthe "other" method -- the so-called "word-method" -- not only does a poor job but actually causes damage. It is an honest and sincere book, but not very well written. For one thing, Flesch repeats the same point about 8 million times. Even he himself admits this in the book: "Did I say this before? Forgive me. I have fallen into the habit of telling people the simple facts about reading over and over again. It seems to be the only way." (Ch 1, p18). Written in the 50's, the book also contains interesting wording that would be considered "non-PC" (politically incorrect) today, such as "Girls prefer fur" (Ch 2, p26).0 von 0 Kunden fanden die folgende Rezension hilfreich. Don't let your kids be taught the wrong way and wind up hating reading. Let them become decoders early in life (i.e. age 5) and by age 7 they will be able to decode anything and read with enjoyment the literature two grade levels above their own. I've taught three sons how to read with a strict phonics method and have third graders reading and enjoying 5th and 6th grade level books. My kindergartener will enter 1st grade with a solid 2nd grade reading level. Don't delay: it's simply, fun and the best thing you can give your kids. Use this book and Siegfried Engelmann's Teach your Child to Read in 100 Easy Lessons. DO IT.
